Models weighing less than 0.55 lbs are exempted, and models in excess of 55 lbs follow a different registration procedure (but still need to be registered to fly at SACRC).


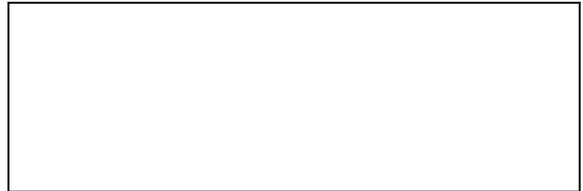
