Officer's Reports:

Treasurer Report:

The Treasurer Report was read by Burt Rosensweig. We are solvent. Matt O'sullivan chipped in \$20.00 for pizza! Maintenance Committee Report:

We want to thank those members responsible for repairing the awnings which were beginning to fall down. Many of the eyes for the hooks were re-welded and a new cable was run through the middle awning.

We are still discussing the issue of replacing/repairing the Astro Turf on the field and in the pit area. We are looking for pieces to replace some which are torn up and impose a tripping hazard.

Mike noted that the runway is 60 feet wide.

We also need to re-staple the seams on the field and replace the straw waddles and spikes.

Safety Committee Report:

Burt noted that it is paramount to check your control surfaces before attempting to fly. A pilot recently crashed his plane on take-off due to reversed ailerons. He also restated the need for everyone to wear sunscreen and to be sure to only plug in at the Pit.

If your plane ends up in one of the ponds, never try to retrieve it by yourself. It is very dangerous as the ponds are full of decomposing debris and sticky mud. If you get in trouble, no one would hear you calling for help.

Spring is the season for tics and mosquitoes. They are a hazards until October.

Be sure to wear high boots if you have to retrieve your plane in the marshes.

We discussed buying some more waders to keep at the field. Use "OFF" or some product like it.
